
In re United Medical Waste Transfer Facility
Request for Site Suitability For a Major Modification of an Existing Site Assignment

Prefiled Testimony of Tim Ryan

1. I am a founder and president of United Medical Waste, Inc. (“UMW”).
2. UMW handles medical waste.
3. I have been involved in all aspects of this business for 11 years.
4. UMW has serviced the Town of Webster for 10 years.
5. UMW provides valuable services to the Town, such as Medical Waste collection kiosks, school based medical waste collection services, free covid waste management consultations for town agencies including the school system, Sharps management programs for senior citizens and other residential medical waste generators, pharmaceutical waste management, and available emergency biohazard response services.
6. UMW operates in full compliance with applicable laws and regulations, and has never had complaints lodged against its business.
7. UMW is requesting to expand its approved Site Suitability Assignment from 56 Worcester Road to incorporate 64 Worcester Road (the “Property”).
8. UMW plans to expand its medical waste handling facility (the “Facility”) to the Property.
9. The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection issued a positive Site Suitability Report on September 4, 2020, wherein it determined that the Property is suitable for the proposed Facility.
10. The Property owner is Kunkel Bus Co., Inc.; the Operator of the Facility is UMW.
11. The Property is industrially zoned.
12. The Property consists of 0.39 acres.

13. The existing site at 56 Worcester Road also consists of 0.39 acres.
14. Together, the parcels have a contiguous area of 18.67 acres.
15. UMW anticipates that the Facility will operate at up to 49 tons per day.
16. UMW anticipates that the hours of operation will be from 7:30am to 6:00pm, Monday through Saturday.
17. The Facility will be used to consolidate medical waste, and will include a covered and enclosed structure for the unloading and reloading of medical waste. No medical waste will be disassembled or compacted.
