This notice shall satisfy the procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the Town of Webster.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

To all interested agencies, groups and persons:

On or about November 10, 2025, the Town of Webster will submit a request to the Massachusetts Executive Office of Housing and Livable Communities (EOHLC) for the release of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383), as amended, to undertake a project known as: **FY 2022 and FY 2023 Webster Mini-Entitlement Grant**, consisting of the following activity:

Golden Heights Housing Development Sidewalk Repairs and Radon Mitigation

The Town proposes to reconstruct up to 600 linear feet of sidewalks and walkways on the Golden Heights property. Sidewalks will be replaced in-kind with regard to size and materials. The work scope includes the following: the full-depth reconstruction of failing sidewalks and resetting of failing curbing.

Prior to undertaking the sidewalk repairs, radon mitigation systems will be installed in the buildings of the Golden Heights Housing Development. Test results indicate a majority of the buildings in the development contain radon levels in excess of 4 pc/l which is considered an acceptable level of exposure. Ventilation systems designed to bring radon levels below 4 pc/l will be installed as needed.

Total Estimated Project Cost: Approximately \$200,000 from CDBG funds

Location: Webster, Worcester County, Massachusetts

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The Town of Webster has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA PL 91-190) is not required. No further environmental review of such project is proposed to be conducted, prior to the request for release of CDBG funds. The Environmental Review Record is on file at the offices of the grantee, Town of Webster, Town Administrator's Office, 350 Main Street, Webster, Massachusetts 01570 and is available for public examination and copying upon request at this office or the Office of Community Development (same address) in Webster during regular business hours which are

Monday 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Tuesday and Thursday 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and Wednesday and Friday 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 Noon.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to Richard LaFond, Town Administrator and Environmental Certifying Officer, Town of Webster. All comments received by November 10, 2025, will be considered by the Town of Webster prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

The Town of Webster will undertake the project described above with Block Grant Funds from EOHLC under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The Town of Webster certifies to EOHLC that the Town of Webster and Richard LaFond, in his official capacity as Environmental Certifying Officer for the Town of Webster, consent to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process, decision making and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The State's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and related laws and authorities and allows the Town of Webster to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

EOHLC will accept objections to its release of funds and the Town of Webster's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) The certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the Town of Webster; (b) The Town of Webster has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) The grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the State; (d) Another federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality.

The only bases upon which EOHLC will disapprove the RROF and certification are set forth above. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76), and shall be addressed to the EOHLC, Division of Community Services, 100 Cambridge Street, Suite 300, Boston, MA 02114. Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by EOHLC. Potential objectors should contact EOHLC to verify the actual last day of the objection period. No objections received after fifteen days from receipt of the community's Request for Release of Funds and Certification will be considered by EOHLC.
